August 5 to September 16, 2022

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Main Goal

To help disciples of Jesus read the New Testament with the appropriate perspectives, backgrounds, and contexts.

Primary Objectives

- Provide NT backgrounds as a whole
- Introduce each group of documents and vital backgrounds for each (Gospels, Acts, Paul's Letters, General Epistles, and Revelation)
- Give interpretive tools, resources, lenses for further study

Core Competencies (10-12)

- 1. Understand vital cultural, political, and religious backgrounds of the first century
- 2. Name the major Second Temple extra-biblical document groups
- 3. Identify when each group of documents was written
- 4. Identify the major authors of NT documents
- 5. Identify audience and occasion for major NT documents
- 6. Pinpoint the purpose for major NT documents
- 7. Place each document within its appropriate literary genre
- 8. Be familiar with the names of NT criticisms and what they mean
- 9. Navigate the general timeframe for major NT documents using the book of Acts as a framework
- 10. Gain confidence in NT interpretation
